CAPACITY BUILDING WORKSHOP FOR FIELD STAFF

A collaborative training workshop was organized for 15 field staff members working under Child Development and Parvaaz programs across eight districts of Kashmir. The workshop equipped field staff with a comprehensive knowledge about the programs, monitoring frameworks, basic MS excel skills, assessment tools and SOPs. At the end, a carefully curated field work kit containing a backpack, stationery, folders, stapler, card board, raincoat and other essential items was distributed among the monitors that will serve as valuable support to their ongoing efforts.

OVER 600 CANDIDATES APPLY FOR BUSINESS INCUBATION PROGRAM

CHINAR has concluded the application phase for the fourth cohort of the Small Business Support program (SBS), attracting an overwhelming response of 600 applications from all the districts of the Kashmir Valley. SBS aims to empower unemployed youth with start-up capital of up to 3.5 lakhs to kickstart their business ventures. Following a four-tier screening process, 50 candidates were shortlisted for the presentation round in front of a panel of experts. These young entrepreneurs are currently refining their business ideas and presentations, gearing up for the finale scheduled in mid-September.

HEALTH CAMP HELD ACROSS 5 DISTRICTS

A series of health camps were organized across five districts for Child Development and Parvaaz program beneficiaries, in collaboration with the Chief Medical Officers of each district. These camps catered to CHINAR enrolled children and families from Srinagar, Shopian, Pulwama, Budgam and Baramulla districts. The medical team consisted of a diverse group of professionals, including general physicians, an ophthalmologist, a dental surgeon, a pharmacist, and a counselor, who diligently conducted thorough examinations for over 600 beneficiaries. These camps also provided supplementary medicines and referrals for further medical intervention.

5-DAY TRAINING PROGRAM FOR WARWAN CLC FACILITATORS

A comprehensive five-day residential training program was conducted in Srinagar for 15 community facilitators hailing from the remote Warwan Valley. The primary goal of the program was to equip these facilitators with essential tools and knowledge to enhance the quality of education provided at the Community Learning Centers (CLCs) within the region. The training program encompassed a wide range of sessions including fundamental teaching strategies and subject-specific modules focused on English, Mathematics and Science. Towards the end of the workshop, the facilitators showcased their newly acquired skills through classroom presentations.
