Four medical camps held under Child Development

CHINAR International, in collaboration with the Chief Medical Officer, conducted four medical camps for children and parents enrolled in the Child Development Program across Srinagar, Budgam, and Kupwara districts. The team collaboratively worked with doctors and specialists from respective districts which included general physicians, dentists, ophthalmologists, pediatricians, gynecologists, counselors, pharmacist, clinical psychologists, and various health workers. Over 400 people including the general public got examined through these camps. A special counter for free medicines was also installed at the event.

Each event commenced with a brief orientation to CHINAR programs, followed by a welcome and introductions. In the end, a debrief and feedback session was held with the team of specialists where they shared their observations, diagnoses, and follow-up approach.

The event at the Srinagar office witnessed the presence of Chief Medical Officer, Dr. Jameel Mir along with various health officials, CHINAR board member and renowned psychiatrist Dr. Mushtaq Margoob, and CHINAR patron, Ms. Ismet Shahmiri who beautifully connected with children and families.

Volleyball Tournament Concludes in Bandipora

CHINAR International, in collaboration with the local Government Higher Secondary School, organized a volleyball tournament at Gadakhud, Bandipora where eight teams from eight different villages of Baramulla and Bandipora districts participated. After a series of initial matches, semifinals were played this month. In the finals, the Khanpeth team beat Gadakhud village by 2-3 in presence of the CHINAR team, committee heads, locals, and staff from GHSS. Trophies were presented to the winning team and the best performers.



CHINAR made an assessment trip to Warwan valley to resume operations of 15 community learning centers (CLCs). The team met with school authorities and zonal offices for sharing the school development plans. Multiple youth interactions were held to explore possible opportunities for small business incubation. One of the major goals of the trip was to set up a base office for Mr. Javed Malik, who recently joined CHINAR as a Project coordinator for Warwan. The team was thrilled to be accompanied by one of our CHINAR patrons, Ms. Ismet Shahmiri, who managed to travel to such difficult terrain with huge accessibility challenges.



Livelihood Given To Srinagar Families

CHINAR International provided livelihood to Shafiq, a single mother from Batamaloo in the form of dress material for ladies to be sold door-door to earn income on a small scale. Enrolled in 2016 under CHINAR's child development program, Shafiq has been divorced for the past 12 years and doing odd jobs to take care of her daughters. All the children have shown consistent performance over the years.

Heena, another impoverished woman lives with her family in a tin shed at Rakh-e-arth, Bemina. Being skilled in tailoring, she was working under a local tailor master on a commission basis and hence never been able to make adequate profit. CHINAR provided her with sewing and an interlock machine to help her gain a self-sustainable income.

Interns Graduate Successfully

Three interns from different colleges successfully concluded a one-month internship program with CHINAR International. The internship was meticulously planned to ensure that the interns get a holistic picture of all the existing programs. The interns were engaged in multiple activities like field visits, interventional sessions, research and documentation and content writing for social media. At the end of internship, the interns presented their learnings and feedback to the team. The team celebrated the accomplishments of the interns group and awarded certificates of completion to them.

E-Lab Marketing Activity at Amira Kadal

CHINAR conducted marketing activity for 30 students enrolled in E-lab program at Government Higher Secondary School, Amira Kadal. A total of 7 E-Lab stalls were installed selling street food, cosmetics, women's accessories, handmade perfumes, clothing, shakes, footwear, etc. The buyers included school students, teachers and members of the CHINAR team. At the end of the activity, each group made profitable income. Director education and school principal also joined the event to encourage the participants. All the students were excited and made plans to spend their share of profit.

E-Labs is one of the programs under CHINAR's youth development which imparts entrepreneurship training and 21st century skills to young students.
