The event featured a soulful start with Quran recitation, Naat, Ladishah, and Qawali performances, setting the tone for creativity and reflection.

The event was graced by many dignitaries including Zonal Education Officer (ZEO) Ghulam Hassan, CHINAR International CEO Abid Qadiri, Heads of Institutions, Cluster Head, teachers, community stakeholders, and parents.

Participants, from classes 6th to 10th, were assigned themes such as drug abuse, education, and happy childhood, encouraging them to reflect on pressing social issues and translate their ideas into artwork. The artwork was evaluated by a panel of judges, and winners were announced before an enthusiastic audience. In addition to awards for top entries, all participating children were presented with certificates as a token of appreciation.

ZEO Ghulam Hassan, while leading the felicitation emphasized the vital role of art in maintaining children's mental health, "Programs like these are very important for the holistic development of children. It pushes their imagination and instills basic values in them," he remarked. Reflecting on the day, Abid Qadiri shared, "More than the event, I was fascinated with the enthusiasm and active participation of everyone."



## Welcoming 240 New Children



This year, through our annual scale-up programs, 240 children from 7 districts were enrolled in CHINAR's Child Development Program. Each child comes from a family navigating difficult circumstances, carefully identified through our three-tier survey process to ensure the most vulnerable were reached. The onboarding was more than just a formality—it was a moment of hope. Parents signed a three-year contract, symbolizing a shared commitment to their children's future. To make the children feel welcomed and valued, each one received a welcome kit containing a school bag and two notebooks.

# **Engaging Communities**

CHINAR International held a Community Stakeholders Meeting with members from Pamposh Colony and Bismillah Colony at Government Boys Middle School, Pamposh Colony, Palpora. The meeting served as a brainstorming session with community members, encouraging them to share their ideas so that their voices are included in efforts to uplift the community more effectively. These students were guided on academic choices, career paths, and admission formalities to make informed decisions for their future.

# Health camp at Kulgam & Shopian





CHINAR International, in collaboration with District Hospital Shopian, BMO Shopian, BMO Keller, Ayush Health & Wellness Centres, and the Health Department, organized a series of free medical camps for the Gatipora, Heerpora, and Sedow communities under the PARVAAZ Program. Over 300 people, including children, adolescents, adults, and the elderly, received free health checkups, diagnostic tests, and medicines. Teams of doctors and specialists provided consultations in general medicine, gynecology, dentistry, ophthalmology, and counseling.

Participants were guided on seeking timely medical support and adopting positive coping strategies to strengthen their mental well-being.
